Various activities are planned for summer and fall orientation

Plans are finalized for this year's fall orientation which is geared to help all students develop positive relationships with other students, faculty and staff, and to learn about the goals and mission of McPherson College. Each new student will be assigned to an orientation group.

The orientation leaders will assist students in learning about activities that have been planned which will help new students adjust to college life and learn how the various offices of the college function in relation to their needs. For returning students, orientation can be a time of learning of important changes that will enhance their college experience. The official opening of Orientation Week begins Sunday, August 29, at 1:30 p.m. with an address to parents and students and the introduction of faculty and administrative staff.

Non-Traditional Students: During the school year much emphasis was placed on meeting regularly with non-traditional students to discuss their needs and obtain feedback regarding life at MAC. This group includes off-campus students and older

persons continuing their education. Students are encouraged to attend a meeting Sunday, August 29, at 3:15 p.m. to learn more about this new organization and to share concerns about being at MAC for the 1982-83 year.

Advisor-Advisee Buffet Dinner: The opening meal of the year will be the traditional dinner with advisors. This is always a good opportunity to meet informally and get acquainted. This meal will be followed by a participation session dealing with items everyone needs to know and students will begin to work on completion of enrollment information.

Orientation Olympics: A special Monday evening of intramural fun and get-acquainted time is planned for the orientation groups as everyone participates in an olympics specially designed for the opening days of school.

Enrollment: Enrollment information and procedures will be given to each student. Enrollment will be Tuesday, August 31, beginning at 8:30 a.m. **Class Walk-Through:** It is important that all students attend classes that will be outlined in the

class walk-through schedule to receive first class meeting assignments and the course syllabi.

Varsity Athletics: All varsity athletes for fall sports will be introduced and short talks will be given by the coaches of these sports. Following this event, will be the traditional watermelon feed at the stadium parking lot. Those interested in cheerleading will have the opportunity to attend two clinics and may tryout on Saturday, September 4.

Fellowship Services: Services are planned for Thursday and Sunday evenings, and will be a time for spiritual reflection and sharing for all those interested in attending.

Picnic: Rounding out the week will be an all-school picnic at Willow Lake for relaxation, swimming and sharing. Don't forget to bring your swimming gear to school to join in this fun.

Computers purchased recently

Seven new Pet Commodore Microcomputers purchased by McPherson College last spring have been used this summer in two computer classes. Students enrolled in Introduction to Microcomputers, a two week class with morning and evening sections, and/or Introduction to Computer Science, a five week class, used the five Pet 4016's and the two Super Pet microcomputers for programming their class assignments.

The disc drive and the printer which accompany the computers

made it possible for students to save their programs and retain print-outs of their efforts.

With the two Harris decwriters and the Harris CRT there are now ten computers available for Basic programming. This increase from three to ten computers should make computer time much more readily available to computer science students.

The computers have been located in Beeghley Hall for the summer classes. This fall they will be located in 407 Harnley.

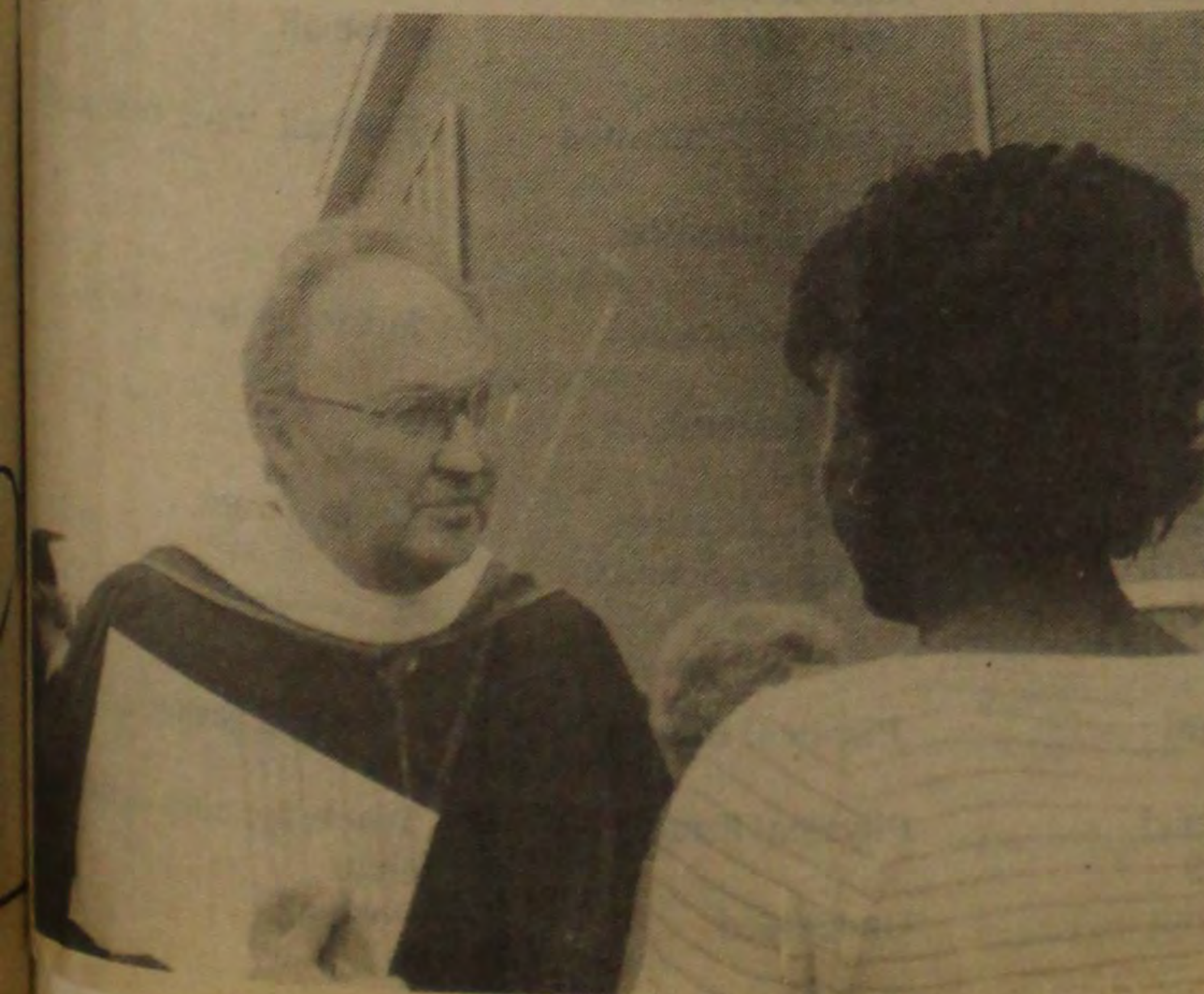

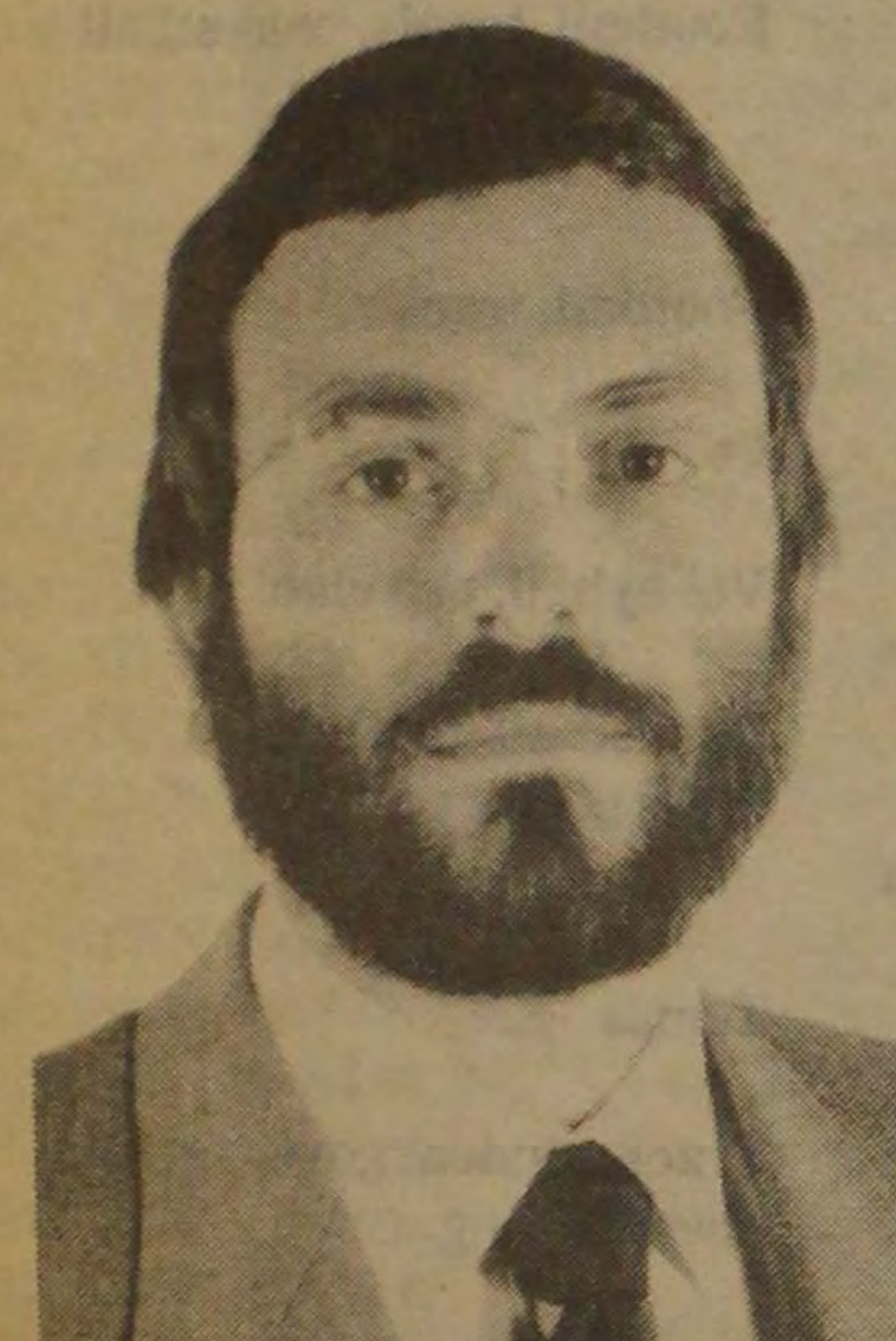

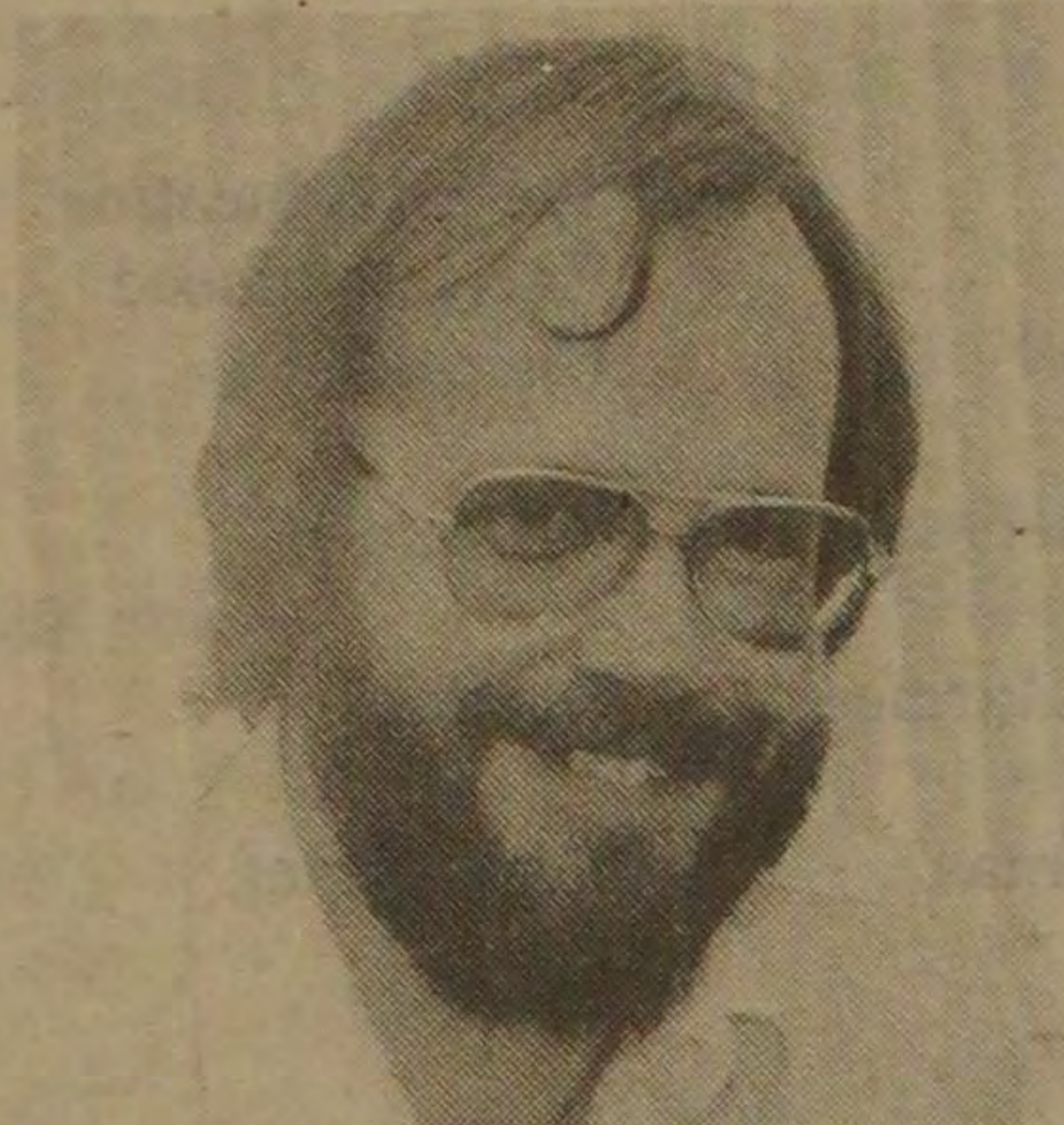

Recent recommendations made to the executive Committee of the Board of Trustees by the Building Committee include: (1) that the gym be located in the vicinity of the current gym-physical education building, and (2) that the current gym be removed and a totally new facility be constructed.

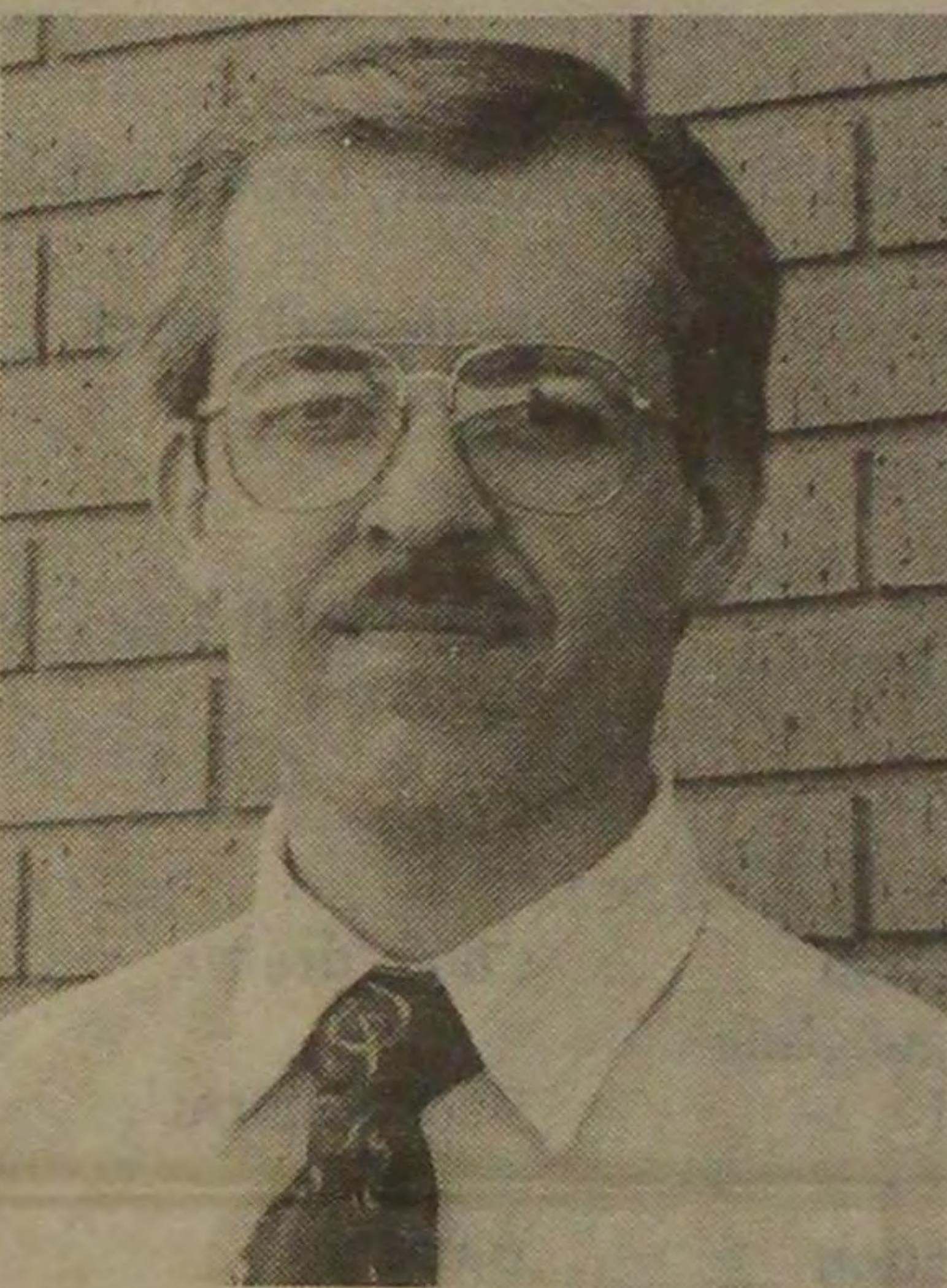
Sandy Walker was hired recently as Financial Aids & Accounts Receivable Secretary, working ¾ time.

Steve and Virginia Mason have been named Residence Hall Directors at Bittering Hall for the 1982-83 school year.

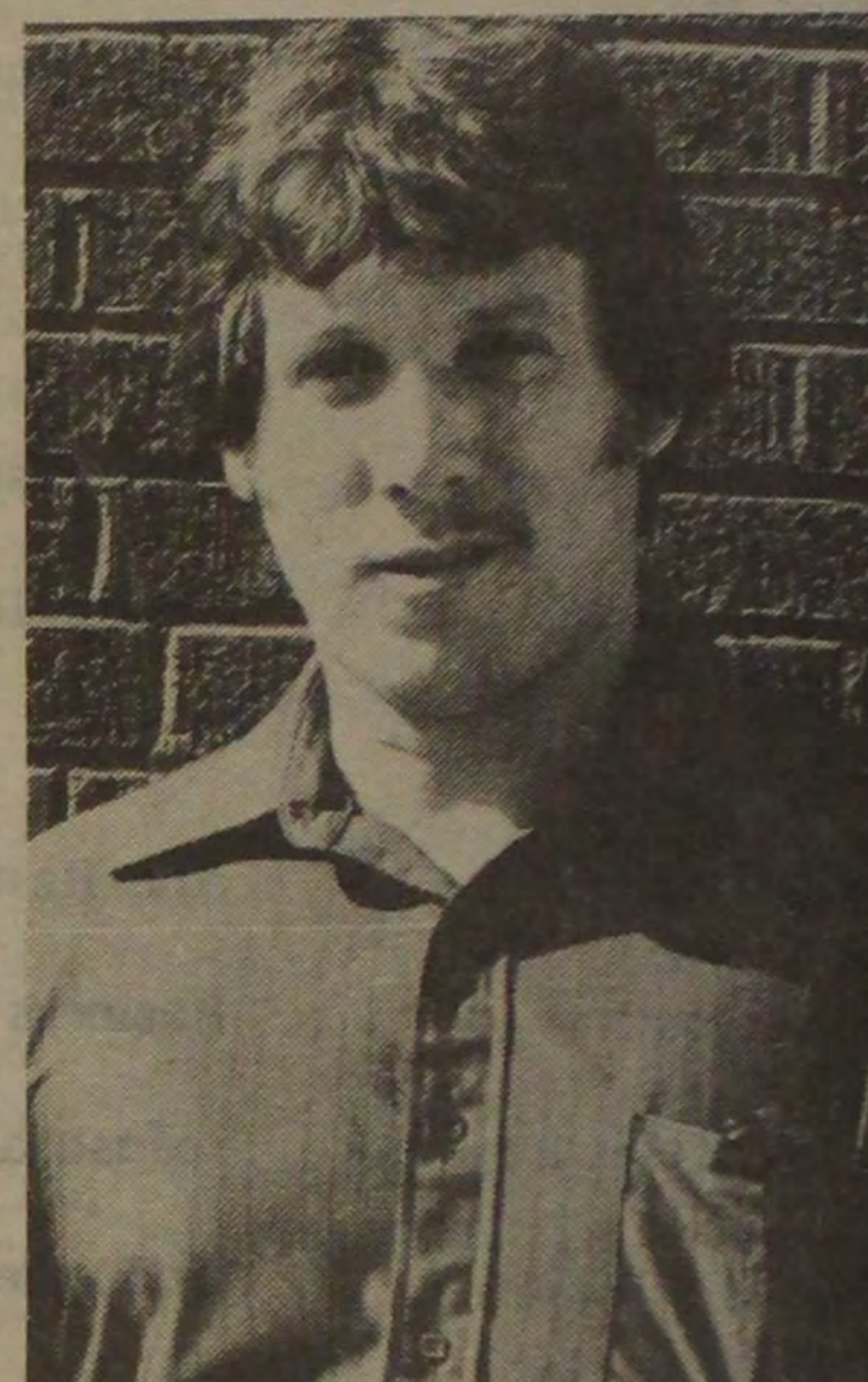
Steve Gallup remembered by students, faculty at Mac

A memorial service was held May 17, 1982, at McPherson College for Steven W. Gallup, a spring semester transfer student from Egan, Illinois. Steve drowned at Marion Lake May 15 while attempting to retrieve an inner tube which had floated beyond the swimming area.

Steven Gallup, son of Donald and Alene Gallup, was born July 6, 1959, in Ogle County, Illinois. He graduated from Leaf River High School in 1977 and attended Highland Community College at Freeport, Illinois until 1979. Steve worked as a tractor mechanic for two years before coming to McPherson College to further his education in agriculture and liberal arts.

On Steve's application for admission to McPherson College he stated, "I wish to enter McPherson to prepare myself for a satisfying career and to develop my own personal growth. McPherson's small size and affiliation with the Church of the Brethren are important factors
