Homecoming At McPherson College

The Annual Homecoming at McPherson College was held December 14, 1945. A number of events took place during the day beginning with a special Homecoming Chapel at 10:00 a. m. directed by the President of the Alumni Association, Mr. Royal Yoder. At 4 o'clock a Homecoming parade left the campus for a march thru town. The parade consisted of floats prepared by individuals and organizations. Immediately following the parade, the Homecoming Alumni Dinner was served in the base! ment of the College Church to a capacity crowd. Messrs, LaVerne Voshell, c'40 and David McGill, c'40 acted as toastmasters. Coach Hayden introduced the basketball team. The ladies quarter furnished special music numbers after which J. H.
