REPRESENTATIVE GARNER E. SHRIVER

Representative Garner E. Shriver has served the Fourth Congressional District, Kansas, for fifteen years on Capitol Hill.

Shriver serves on several committees and is ranking member on the House Foreign Operations sub-Committee. From 1961 to 1964 he served on the House Judiciary Committee. He is also now a member of the Task Force on Economic Reform.

Among the many bills Shriver has sponsored or co-sponsored are ones that provide for radio and television coverage of House floor proceedings, establishing the study of simplifying income tax procedures, and another bill allowing for the increase of outside earning limitations of Social Security recipients to \$4,000.

Shriver has received six "Watchdog of the Treasury" awards from the National Associated Businessmen in recognition of his support for fiscal integrity and responsibility in government.

A graduate of the University of Wichita (now Wichita State), Congressman Shriver earned his law degree from Washburn Law School in Topeka. After serving in the U.S. Navy during World War II, he was elected to the Kansas State Legislature in 1947, where he served through 1960.

He and his wife, Martha, reside in Wichita, and they have three children, all married.
