## *In Memory of Frank Forney*



Memories of Frank W. Forney, "Uncle Frank," as he was known by McPherson College students during his thirty-three years as superintendent of building and grounds, are those of one who served and loved college students.

Uncle Frank died February 24 at the age of 74 and his memorial service was held in the college church February 28. He had retired from active service on July 1, 1952.

Much of Uncle Frank's work was taken for granted as it was done so regularly, so repeatedly, so unceasingly. His interest was in the welfare of the college students and the ongoing life of college.

Forney Heating Plant, erected in 1940, is a symbol of Uncle Frank's concern for the physical comfort of the students and is a tribute to a life given for others.





## *Coach Chalmer Woodard*

With the resignation of Coach Chalmer "Woody" Woodard, one of the most illustrious periods of McPherson College athletics has come to a close. "Woody's" record, when he arrived at McPherson College, had been nothing short of spectacular, but here he encountered a seemingly insurmountable task.

To say that the change in athletics at McPherson was miraculous would be an understatement. In the fall of 1950, working with a team composed mostly of green freshmen, "Woody" was able to win three games in an eight-game schedule. In basketball that year McPherson won four in the conference and had an overall season's record of eleven wins and nine losses. The track team that year received third place in the conference meet.

The 1951-52 season got off to a fast start as the football team won second place in the conference with a 7-2 record. The basketball squad captured second place, winning sixteen games and losing six. The track team was "Woody's" third team that year to capture a second in the conference.

This fall, the football team won the conference championship for the first time in 30 years and was undefeated in nine games. The basketball team this year again was second in the conference.

"Woody's" new job is head football coach at Southern Methodist University. He assumed that job the first of March and has signed a three-year contract with the college. Included in the teams that SMU will play next year are Kansas University, Georgia Tech, and Notre Dame.


The McPherson College football team this year finished the season undefeated for the first time in McPherson College history with a eight-win, no-loss, and one-tie record. The Bulldogs, under "Woody's" coaching, also won the conference crown for the first time in three decades.

Most of the players were playing under "Woody" for the third season in a row, and the team broke many records. Some of the new records were: most touchdown passes in a game by Wayne Blicken-staff; a total points in a season, 108 by Dwight McSpadden; most yards gained in a season by the team; most points in a season; and most passes intercepted.

As a recognition of the great McPherson team, the following were picked by the coaches of the conference as first team all-conference players: on offense—Eddie Hall and Gene Smith in the backfield; George Keim, Bob Powell, Roland Delay, and Jack Richardson in the line; on defense—John Robinson, Bob Peal, and George Keim. George Keim at tackle and Wayne Blicken-staff at quarterback made honorable mention on the Little All-American.

The new coach, wherever he is, will have most of the football players back next year, since only four players are graduating.

Coach "Woody" Woodard's 1953 Bulldogs captured second place in the Kansas Conference for the second year in a row with a 14-9 season's record and 9-3 conference record. One of the highlights of the season was a 57-49 victory over Colorado State, a school much larger than McPherson.

The team this year had no outstanding player on it, but all of the starting five and most of the bench were capable of scoring points on any given night. As an example of this, seven different McPherson College players were high point men this season. All of these same seven players scored over 100 points.

Wayne Blickenstaff was the leading scorer of the team with 211 points scored on 100 field goals and 96 free throws.

Two seniors made up the starting five. They were Bob Beckel and Frank "Chief" Hanagarne. Both also earned their fourth letter this year.

An early season inability to hit the basket hurt the Bulldogs somewhat as did also a habit of playing one bad quarter among the four of the game. With most of the same players coming back next year, the prospects are for another good season in 1954.

## Track Team

The 1952 version of the McPherson track team under the leadership of Coach "Woody" Woodard enjoyed their most successful season in history as they won five dual meets, two triangular meets, and the Wichita University Freshmen Invitational, and placed second in the conference meet.

The team also made an amazing effort to rewrite completely the McPherson College record books. Dale Carpenter broke three records—the 120-yard high hurdles, which he ran in 15.4; the 220-yard low hurdles covered in the fast time of 24.7; and the broad jump, which he broke in the NAIB tournament with a 22' 9 1/4" jump.

Dave Metzler broke two McPherson records. The first of his records was set in the high jump when he cleared the bar at 6' 3 1/2". Then he went to the NAIB tournament and broke his own half-mile record with a 1:55.8 effort.

John Robison also broke a McPherson College individual record by heaving the shot put 42' 3".

Also five new relay records were set by McPherson College teams. These were: the Mile Relay, a time of 3:30.5 (Carpenter, Miller, Smith, Kerr); the Sprint Medley, a time 3:40.6 (Heidebrecht, Kerr, Carpenter, Metzler); the Distance Medley, a time of 10:57.1 (Kerr, Goodfellow, Bechtel, Metzler); the two-mile relay a time of 8:20.6 (Sharp, Goodfellow, Metzler, Bechtel); and the half-mile relay, a time of 1:33.0 (Carpenter, Miller, Smith, Kerr).




