The course of instruction embraces Epistolary, and Ornamental Writing Old English, German Text, Lettering of all kinds, Shipple Work, India Ink, Shading, Card Writing, Flourishing, Engrossing, Line Shading on Faces, Flowers, Memorials, Diplomas, Resolutions etc.

## STENOGRAPHY AND TYPEWRITING.

The design of this department is to meet the rapidly increasing demand for this valuable art.

The growing importance of this most useful accomplishment has awakened the interest of business men, and the services of a competent shorthand amanuensis are considered indispensable.

We aim in this department, as in all others to keep abreast of the times and nething shall be left undone which will aid the student in becoming proficient in the art.

Typewriting is taught in connection with shorthand. Students are required to transcribe business letters etc., from their shorthand notes.

This is excellent practice for the student and gives him confidence in himself. Students in this department are taught correct fingering, touch, and proper ear of the machine.

### MUSICAL DEPARTMENT.

This department is established for the purpose of affording superior advantages for the study of music in Piano-forte, Organ, Voice Culture, Harmony and Chorus Drill.

#### PIANO-FORTE.

Special attention is given to the musical touch and a refined and elegant style of playing. "The Theoretical and Practical Piano School" of S. Lebert and L. Stark has been adopted as a course of study. It is adapted both to the beginner and to him who wishes to solve the most difficult problems of the art.

#### CABINET ORGAN.

Systematic instruction is given in technical execution, in playing church music, short voluntaries and interludes, all of which exercises are intended to fit persons for the various uses of the instrument.

#### CHORUS DRLL.

Several classes in vocal music will be organized. An advanced class affords, facilities for becoming acquainted with Oratorios and other sacred music, for two dollars per term.

#### HARMONY.

Richter's Manual of Harmony will be used as a course of study.

# BIBLE COURSE.

At no other time in the world's history has there been so great an interest manifested in the investigation of Biblical facts as now. In an institution like-this, it has become necessary to offer facilities for a systematic study of the Bible. To meet this necessity, a course has been grammed-to suit all who may wish to study it, whether they pursue it several years or only a few months.

The Bible is used as the chief text-boook. Other books and branches are employed only to make the truths of the Bible more easily understood and more readily taught. In connection with the books of the Old and the New Testament, one may study

Grammar, Mental Science,
Rhetoric, Moral Science,
Elocution, Church History,
Evidences of Christianity, Church Government,

Those who wish to pursue a more extended course, may study Hebrew and New Testament Greek and thus become familiar with the languages in which the Old and the New Testament were written. Books of reference and Johnson's excellent maps of Bible lands are also used.

## Special Bible Course.

This course is adapted to those who wish to prepare themselves for Sunday school teachers or who simply wish to obtain a better knowledge of the Bible. This course embraces:

The Geography of the Bible; the Land of the Bible; the History of the Bible; the Canon of Scriptures; the Institutions of the Bible; How to Study the Bible; Principles of Instruction; Methods of instruction etc.

No effort will be spared to make the Bible study 'as profitable as possible to all, and especially to young ministers.

## GENERAL INFORMATION.

#### AIM.

The aim of the institution is to provide a thorough, Christian education. The end of this implies such intellectual, moral, and religious training as shall harmoniously develop the entire being.) It advocates plainness of dress, and simplicity in the habits of life, discourages caste, thus making it a home for rich and poor alike.

#### LOCATION.

The college is located on College Place, a beautiful site in the eastern part of the city of McPherson, Kansas. This city may be reached by any one of the four leading railways of the West: Rock Island, Santa Fe, Missouri Pacific, and Union Pacific Street car line from depots direct to college campus.

#### BUILDINGS AND GROUNDS.

A convenient building, forty feet wide, one hundred feet long, and four stories high, has been completed and is used as a dormitory. It is equipped for both ladies and gentlemen. Each student's room is well lighted, carpeted, and furnished with spring bed, mattress, chairs, table, and whatever is needed for convenience and comfort. Bath rooms, hot and cold water, and steam heat are provided for all students. Well prepared food is in abundance and variety for all who come. The main building, ninety-four by one hundred and seventeen feet, is sufficiently far advanced for recirction purposes. The campus is a plat of ten acres, set in grass, evergreeus, and shade trees, and surrounded by a thrifty young hedge.

#### ADMISSION.

The college is open to all persons of good moral character, who mry wish to avail themselves of its privileges, and who are sufficiently far advanced to prosecute successfully the studies of the course they may wish to enter. Applicants for admission to any classes will be examined in the previous studies leading to the branches they wish to pursue. Those who present certificates of good standing may be admitted without further examination.

#### LIBEART.

A good collection has already been made and more books will be added from time to time. Donations are solicited and will be thankfully accepted.

#### MUSEUM.

The foundation for a first class museum has been laid and further contributions are solicited.

#### APPARATUS.

The college is supplied with the necessary physical and chemical apparatus, a large proportion of which has been secured during the past year, and more will added as needed!

#### REPORTS.

A monthly card is issued for each pupil, giving the standing in each branch pursued and deportment during the month. These cards are sent to the parents or guardians when the pupil is under twenty-one. A class and deportment record is kept of each student, which becomes the property of the college, as a perpetual memorial of the degree of his fidelity and sobolarly attainments.

#### LITERARY. SOCIETIES.

Among the attractions of the school are the two flourishing Literary Societies, conducted by the students, the "Cicepmian" and "Emersonion." They hold their meetings weekly. Every student is expected to become a member of one of these societies.

#### MORAL AND RELIGIOUS INFLUENCES.

It is the aim of the institution not only to discipline the intellect, but also to inculcate the principles of morality and the truths of religion. The public exercises of each day are opened with religious worship. Beligious services are held in the chapel both morning and evening on each Lord's day. A students prayer meeting is held on each Wednesday evening. The students are divided into sections. Each section holds its evening service before retiring for the night. Few institutions have equal moral surroundings. There is not a saloon in the city and the prohibitory law is as well enforced as any other.

#### GOVERNMENT AND DISCIPLINE.

General good conduct, such as becomes true men and women anywhere, is expected of all. Every student is encouraged in the formation of character of the highest type. The institution places students upon their honor and kindly, yet firmly, justes or conduct worthy of their high position. The institution is not a reformatory. A negligent or immoral student will be kindly admonished, and affectionate personal endeavor will be employed in his behalf; but if this fails he can not remain connected with the school.

Promptness and fidelity in all college duties are insisted on as nec-

essary disciplinary preparation for a successful life.

Disloyal students and those whose presence and influence in the judgement of the faculty are detrimental to the highest interests of the institution may be dismissed from it at any time.

#### RULES AND REGULATIONS.

Students should bring with them, besides text-books, a Bible
or Testament, Brethren's Hymn book or Gospel Hymns, towels, and a
blanket or two, and should have their garments marked with full name.

All students are required to be present at chapel exercises and all recitations; also to attend Sunday school and one church service each Lord's day, at the college chapel, or at some other place where their parents may direct in writing.

8. Students are required to go to their rooms at the ringing of the study bell and observe order so as not to disturb others in study.

4. Students must extinguish their lights promptly at ten o'clock P. M. unless excused by the professor in charge of the hall.

5. No lady or gentleman will be allowed to trespass on the territory of the opposite sex, except by special permission of the president.

6. Students desiring to leave the grounds or to visit other students during study hours must obtain permission from the professor in charge of their ball.

7. Ladies and gentlemen will not ride, walk or play together except by special arrangement with the president.

 Students will be held responsible for misconduct in their rooms and damage done to school property.

9. No student rooming in the Dormitory shall be absent after ten o'clock P. M. unless by permission of the president.

- Students may organize literary societies which shall be governed and controlled by a constitution and by-laws, approved by the faculty.
- 11. Students desiring to visit the cemetery or go to the city; roust obtain permission from the president, except on Saturday afternoons between the hours of one and four o'clock when general liberty to go to the city and return is grauted.
- 12. Students will be permitted to meet in the chapel for social in tercourse, twenty minutes immediately after supper of each day—Sunday excepted—also for twenty minutes after the close of society meeting. Such social meetings to be under the supervision of one or more of the faculty.
- 13. Visitors desiring to call upon students in the building must apply to the president
- 14. All members of the Brethren or German Baptist church, are required to comply with the principles of non-conformity to the world and to conform to the general order of the church in apparel and wearing of the hair. Those who are not members of the German Baptist church are expected to make no display in the use of jewelry and to observe the laws of plainness and simplicity in their apparel.

#### PROHIBITIONS.

Card playing and similar games; (b) the use of the bacco and chewing gum on the college premises; (e) noisy, disporterly and unseemly conduct; (d) fire arms or weapons of any kind; (e) the use of profane or obscene language; (f) visiting immoral places; (g) musical instruments except such as are used in the musical department.

In the enforcement of these rules and regulations any member of the faculty or any officer of the institution is empowered to correct irregularities and require obedience. Failure to comply on the part of any student will subject him to reprimand, suspension, or expulsion at the discretion of the faculty.

#### FINANCES.

It is to the advantage of parents, and the student, that spending money be deposited with the business manager, to be used as needed.

Although our rates for boarding, if paid in advance for the year, are \$1.69 per week, yet students by boarding themselves, have during the past year reduced this expense to \$1.00 per week and ever less.
