

















and a heart breaker to Ottawa.


The Bulldogs qualified again for the District 10 playoff, only to lose in overtime to Mid-America Nazarene, and finished the season 15-11.









Classroom presentations are provided to ensure an overview of mechanical systems and restoration business and shop practices.


The major goal of the restoration program is to teach auto restoration at its best. The vehicle classifications and quality standards of national automobile clubs play a





## Student Council

called for a decision concerning the disbursement of approximately \$10,000. This was solved by establishing an endowment fund, which will generate interest to be used to fund future Councils, and by purchasing an electronic bulletin board for the Student Union.




